Violence against Children

Globally up to <u>1 billion</u> children have experienced physical, sexual or psychological violence in the past year.





Magnitude of Violence against Children



Homicide is among the **top five** causes of death in adolescents.



80% of homicide victims are boys.



Beyond these deaths, **tens of millions** more children are affected by violence.



1 in 4 children suffer physical abuse.



Nearly **1 in 5** girls is sexually abused at least once in her life.




Overview of Global Data on Violence Against Children

young children (176 million) live with a mother who is a victim of intimate partner violence.



young children are regularly subjected to violent discipline by their caregivers.



Percentage of children aged 2 to 4 years who experienced any violent discipline in the past month, by type



of children under age 5 live in countries where corporal punishment at home is fully prohibited.



15 million

girls aged 15 to 19 have experienced forced sex in their lifetime.






Weak Child Protection System = Vicious Circle




The Continuum of Services




