








Identified Challenges



Interviewing of the child victims/witnessess by a trained specialist

Interviewing of children in specially equipped rooms

Cooperation between all involved stakeholders





Interview conduct – need for a specialist

Non-specialist = RISK OF.....

Absence of general understanding and knowledge of the essential principles



loss of the evidence value

re-victimization





Need for the "Green Rooms"

Accessibility of the premisses

34 child-friendly rooms functioning in Ukraine,

25 established in the territorial police units,

4 within the police universities,

3 within social services premises and

2 within NGOs premises.

Only 25 rooms from the abovementioned number meet the criteria of child-friendly room,

6 rooms are equipped with the video recording system

3 have only 1 equipped room.

15 regions without any "Green Room"
